FACE COVERINGS

On April 15, 2020 Governor Cuomo issued an Executive Order requiring all people in New York to wear a mask or face covering when out in public and in situations when social distancing cannot be maintained.

The Lake Flower apartments is one of two public housing projects run by the Housing Authority. The common areas/spaces are public spaces. Further, the elevators/hallways do not always allow for appropriate social distancing.

Let me be clear: masks are required at all times in common areas. Common areas include all doorways, hallways, elevators, laundry rooms, mail rooms. Staff have noticed and have expressed serious concern that resident/visitor compliance has slipped. This is unacceptable as it jeopardizes everyone's health.

To repeat what has been said and written dozens of times over the last six months, wearing a mask protects you and others. Wearing a mask is proven to help prevent the transmission of COVID-19. To put it plainly, it is disrespectful to yourself, your family, your friends, your neighbors, and staff not to wear a mask.

One person getting sick can lead to many others getting sick and, possibly, dying.

I am canvassing New York housing authorities to learn how others in the state and, specifically, in the North Country are addressing this issue. As I write this, I have received several responses. Please note: more stringent enforcement/penalties may be forthcoming.

Our lives depend on it.

Bed Bug Information Center

Where should you look?

- Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- Door, window, and baseboard trim
- Items on the floor

What should you look for?

- All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.

- Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!
- Vacuum frequently.
- Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.
