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Sarah's News

The Housing Authority's Lake Flower and Algonquin apartments accommodate 113 households. With this relatively large number of households in close proximity to one another, conflict between households, while not frequent, does occur. Two primary sources of conflict are smoking and dogs.

Everyone knows smoking is not permitted on Housing Authority property. At the Lake Flower high rise, I've observed smokers do one of three things: (1) go across the street to the park; (2) stand on the sidewalk; or (3) go to the parking lot across Maple Hill Drive.

Smoke travels quite some distance and is easily detectable. With the warm weather here and with windows open, I respectfully ask smokers to keep these facts in mind and, to the extent possible, maximize your distance from the high rise.

On the topic of dogs, everyone also knows that dog owners are responsible for picking up after their dogs. At Lake Flower, the Housing Authority provides bags in front of the high rise. At Algonquin, dog owners are responsible for obtaining/using bags.

Cleaning up after one's dog is part of the Pet Policy. Specifically, Section 18.8 of the Pet Policy, in part, states, "Repeated substantiated complaints by neighbors or Harrietstown Housing Authority personnel regarding pets disturbing the peace of neighbors through noise, odor, animal waste, or other nuisance may result in the owner having to remove the pet or move him/herself." This also pertains to the Algonquin Apartment backyards; staff need to mow these areas. The Housing Authority will enforce this.

When off Housing Authority property, a Village ordinance requires dog owners to clean up after their pets. From the November 28, 2018 Adirondack Daily Enterprise:

"There's a local ordnance [sic] ... dogs defecate, and people are supposed to clean up after their dog," said Saranac Lake village police Chief Chuck Potthast. "If indeed an officer sees somebody that has not cleaned up, we will approach the person and ask them to clean up. If they wouldn't do that in, in fact, then we would cite them."

I hope everyone, not just the smokers and dog owners, spends time outdoors this month. This is the weather we looked forward to in March, April, and, even May and June!

Bed Bug Information Center

Where should you look?

- Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- Door, window, and baseboard trim
- Items on the floor

What should you look for?

- All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.

- Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!
- Vacuum frequently.
- Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.

The sooner we know, the lower the cost to you.
