Update #1. The March REAC inspection resulted in a score of 89 for the Lake Flower Apartments. The inspector deducted 6.9 points because a recently developed frost heave prevented the trash room doors from operating properly. We appealed this deduction to HUD and WON! The Lake Flower score has been revised to 96. With that database adjustment, the Harrietstown Housing Authority, once again, is designated a High Performer.

Update #2. The Lake Flower façade project cleared another hurdle with the Village Development Board's approval. Once we receive the State's concurrence that environmental review is complete, we can request the release of the State grant funds and proceed to Go. Go means the finalization of project specs, the preparation/announcement of bid packages, and the bid award.

Debbie Zerrahn is officially retired. The May 10 party in the Lake Flower Community Room was very nice. Great people, great decorations, great food! Thanks to all who helped make it happen. As I type this, I imagine Debbie sipping her hot chocolate and enjoying being amongst people and at a place she enjoys.

Bed Bug Information Center

Where should you look?

- Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- Door, window, and baseboard trim
- Items on the floor

What should you look for?

- All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.

- Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!
- Vacuum frequently.
- Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.

The sooner we know, the lower the cost to you.
