

Real **E**state **A**ssessment **C**enter. **REAC.** March 13 for the Lake Flower Apartments and March 14 for the Algonquin Apartments.

As I wrote last month, this is a BIG DEAL. These inspections score us on the physical condition of the developments' sites, buildings, exteriors, mechanical systems, common areas, and apartments. The scores enter into a larger calculation of how much money we receive from the government and how often the REAC inspections occur.

The facilities/maintenance staff - David, John, and Bob - is working hard to identify and prepare for the inspections. We depend on YOU, the residents, to notify us if you are aware of issues needing attention. We do not want to lose points because you failed to call in a work order for a non-functioning toilet.

To that end, maintenance staff will conduct a quick run-through of all units in the days leading up to the inspections. The purpose will be to identify any issues requiring immediate attention. You will receive formal notice of this in coming weeks. You will also receive a formal notice of the REAC inspection, itself.

Thank you very much for your cooperation. It is appreciated.

On another note, we received word that we've been awarded \$500,000 from New York State to assist with the Lake Flower Apartments' façade renovation project! With this grant award, we have the needed \$2.1 million to undertake the project. Right now, we are plowing through a lot of paperwork and red tape to obtain needed approvals and permits. With a lot of luck the project will take place this year. With less luck, it will occur next year.

Spring is not too far off.... The morning walk to work is filled with bird song. March will have its surprises; but, winter will lose its grip. I'm getting ready.



HAPPY HEALTHY ATTITUDES

Bed Bug Information Center

Where should you look?

- Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- Door, window, and baseboard trim
- Items on the floor

What should you look for?

- All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.

- Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!
- Vacuum frequently.
- Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.

The sooner we know, the lower the cost to you.
