At its June 20 meeting, the Harrietstown Housing Authority Board of Commissioners adopted an Emergency Preparedness Plan. Its purpose is to have a clear but detailed procedure to mitigate threats to residents, staff, property, and business operations in a manner that emphasizes safety, efficiency, and disciplined communication. The Plan, the product of a committee made up of Housing Authority staff and commissioners, included outreach to and input from a wide range of local, regional, state, and federal partners and experts. Research also included other housing authorities' plans.

The Plan is written for Housing Authority staff and includes:

- Details regarding the declaration of an emergency
- Direction and coordination in the event of an emergency
- Basic procedures
- Emergency- and location-specific procedures
- Safeguards to protect information
- Steps to ensure the continuity of critical business functions and fulfillment of obligations
- Requirements for training, tests, drills, and updates

Tenant Tip Sheets are being prepared and will be posted in all apartments. These list important steps to be taken in the event of a fire or other emergency.

While emergencies are rare, it is critical that staff and tenants know what to do if one occurs.

On another note, I hope everyone has enjoyed the summer. It's been hot, sunny, humid, and, at times, rainy. In other words, summer! I've noticed that leaves on some trees, trees that are stressed for one or another reason, have already started to turn color. With each passing day, the sun spends less time above our horizon. 

Bed Bug Information Center

Where should you look?

- Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- Door, window, and baseboard trim
- Items on the floor

What should you look for?

- All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.


- Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!
- Vacuum frequently.
- Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.

The sooner we know, the lower the cost to you.
